Summary of the results of the DNR Fish Netting Survey of Douglas Lake in May, 1977, is as follows:

Netted, measured, and returned to the lake, from six random net locations in the lake, was a total of 2,129 fish. Nets were set at 6 to 10 foot of water depth over a l0-day period. Nets were pulled each day. The fish length and number counted is listed below.

The small mouth bass were tagged with a round orange-colored tag with a 5-digit serial number attached to a fin. The DNR has requested our Association to notify all fishermen to please turn in these tags.
