	 Dr. Nadelhoffer announced the retirement of Bob VandeKopple; potential replacements are being interviewed.
	 Dr. Nadelhoffer will soon begin a year-long sabbatical at the University of Copenhagen; will return as UMBS Director, Summer 2018. Dr. Linda Greer, will serve as Interim Director during Dr. Nadelhoffer's absence.
