"They can be an ideal tool for landowners who want to preserve their land's natural and historic heritage for future generations, while maintaining private ownership. Land protected with a conservation easement need not be open to the public and continues to carry many of the normal benefits of private land ownership. The primary motivation behind a conservation easement must be conservation. It is a legal document restricting future uses of the land. The easement is agreed upon and signed by the landowner (the easement donor) and the Conservancy (the party receiving the easement). The Conservancy accepts the easement with the understanding that it must enforce the terms of the easement in perpetuity. After the easement is signed, it is recorded with the County Register of Deeds and applies to all future owners of the land." (LTC Conservation Easement Guidebook)  Motion passed.
