Who we are -- Purpose Statement from the 2019 Bylaws

The purpose of the Association is to preserve, protect and improve the quality of Douglas Lake and its environs and the quality of life of its residential community and for the general public.

What we do -- DLIA Programs

- Participate in the Clean Boats, Clean Waters program
- Monitor and control the invasive species Purple Loosestrife
- Conduct lake studies as needed to monitor for invasive species and to help improve the shoreline and water quality – Aquatic Plant Survey, Shoreline Survey, Water Quality Monitoring
- Set and monitor loon nesting platforms for loon preservation
- Work with the DNR for fish management
- Participate in the Michigan Adopt-A-Highway for US 31
- Provide educational materials
- Maintain knowledge of and a working relationship with the township, county and state government including the DNR and EGLE (formerly DEQ), and other entities such as, Tip of the Mitt Watershed Council, Little Traverse Conservancy, and the University of Michigan Biological Station
- Liaise with Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians about areas of mutual interest
- Provide UMBS local student scholarship
- Support Tip of the Mitt Watershed Council’s Watershed Academy at Pellston High School
- Cooperate with the Munro Township for the township boat ramp at the end of Douglas Lake Road

Lake Wise Words

Property values are impacted by the health of a lake.

- Soften your shoreline to be kind to the lake and to reduce erosion. Leave at least a six-foot natural buffer area between the lake and your lawn.
- Reduce the use of fertilizer and pest controls as they contribute pollutants to the lake.
- Pump your septic system regularly. Remove abandoned shoreline septic tanks.
- Clean trailers, boats and other recreational vehicles especially when moving between different bodies of water. Also, clean boots, kayaks and paddleboards ... anything that goes in and out of the lake.

Good Neighbor Practices

PLEASE

Pets	Pick up after your pet on private property and public walkways. Remember that a constantly barking dog can be a source of irritation to your neighbors.
Lights	Outdoor lights should be shielded and aimed downward. They should not shine in your neighbor's windows. Turn off outdoor lights when not actively in use.
Roads	For everyone's safety, please drive within the speed limit. Be considerate of walkers, dog walkers, bicyclists, horseback riders and horse-drawn carriages on our roads.
Household waste	Wait until your assigned trash pickup day to put bags out. Use sturdy locked containers to protect bags. If you need to leave, ask a neighbor for help. See the next section for recycling options.
Beach/Yard Fires	Be aware of DNR's fire level and attend a fire with a means of extinguishing readily on hand.
Jet Skis/Wake Boats	Be considerate of bottomland/shoreline/dock damage from continuous high wakes too close to shore. Use less-populated areas of lake for extended jet ski/wake boat use.
Fireworks	Restrict fireworks to the appropriate holidays between dusk and 11 p.m.
