
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Linda contacted all refuse haulers in the Cheboygan and Emmet County area and found two that were willing to begin collections. While Linda was making the contacts I began to draft a letter to members. Both companies are now collecting. I am reprinting the contact information in this issue as some have lost their original letter. If you are a summer or part time resident you may want to check with your winter neighbors and see who they decided to use. This is what I did, now during the late Fall through the early Spring months I will just buy the bags and know that the truck will be out to service the winter folks and collect my garbage on the route.




Bernard Nicholas Hansen of Grandville and a long time summer resident of Douglas Lake died on March 24 at age 88 after a brief illness. He and his wife Florence first discovered Douglas Lake in the 1940's where they stayed in a tar-paper shack next to railroadman, Howard Yarman's cottage near Bell's Resort on Silver Strand Road. For many years, the family spent summer vacations at Reed's Resort before building their cottage at 8624 Silver Strand Road in the 1960's. Bernie is survived by his daughter, Debra of Petoskey, sister-in-law Virginia, niece Judy den Otter of Hesperia and family, many friends, and his beloved canine companion, Mitzi. He was a Staff Sergeant in World War II stationed in southern Germany where he managed a motor pool. An employee of Michigan Bell Telephone for most of his working life, he was an avid hunter and fisherman.

Elton R. Mike Kerr of Orchard Lake MI and Douglas Lake, age 80, died January 13 at the Woodland Hills Care Center in Bloomfield Hills. A long-time manufacturers' representative in the auto industry, he was an active member of the Service Corps of Retired Executives (SCORE). He was also a member of the Orchard Lake Country Club, Society of Manufacturers' Representatives and Sigma Chi fraternity. He was born on July 18, 1925, at Bridgeport, CT, a son of Raymond C. and Ethel I. Kerr. The family later lived in Schenectady, NY, until moving to Ann Arbor in 1941. After graduation from Ann Arbor High School, he enlisted in the Army Air Corps and served as a navigator-bombardier during World War II. Mike was graduated from the University of Michigan in 1949, and on June 10, 1949,

he married Joyce M. Rogers of Pontiac. They lived briefly in Marion, OH, before returning to Michigan, in the Birmingham area. In addition to his wife, Mike is survived by four children, Susan (James) Gartin of Ann Arbor and Douglas Lake, Elizabeth Kerr of Douglas Lake, Gretchen (Raymond) Francini of Crystal Lake, IL, and William (Rhonda) Kerr of Rochester Hills; seven grandchildren and a brother, Richard C. Kerr of Leland.

Louise "Weezie" Marsh Robinson died July 24, 2005, in Seattle, Washington. Weezie first came to Douglas Lake with her parents, Matilda and Hort Marsh, in the early 1940's visiting her mother's sister, Jean Foster Fleming. In the mid 1950's her parents purchased property on MacAruthur Road. This cottage is now owned by her daughter, Helen Robinson Bryant. She was born in Pittsburgh, September 29,1927, where she attended both Ellis and Winchester Schools. She received her B.S. degree from Connecticut College for Women. Weezie worked for Quaker Oats as a chemist and later at Technical Publishing in Barrington. In 1993, Weezie moved to Seattle. She was predeceased by her husband Shepard "Shep" Douglas Robinson. She is survived by their daughters Helen Robinson (William A.) Bryant of Sarasota, FL; Marsha Robinson and Susan Robinson (Craig) Donarum, both of Seattle, WA. A very gracious lady she will be missed by her family and Douglas Lake neighbors.

Lee H. Warren died December 4, 2005, in his home town of Jackson Michigan. Born on December 31, 1916 he lived most of his life in Jackson. After retiring from Gilbert Commonwealth in 1984 he devoted many hours volunteering with the American Red Cross, his local township fire department and his church. It was in the 1950's that Lee and his wife Marian purchased a cottage on Douglas Lake. Over the years Lee spent many wonderful days and nights enjoying the lake life with Marian and his three daughters. In addition to his wife Lee is survived by his daughters Cynthia Takimoto, Kristina (Neal) Barncard and Debra Foote. A quiet, steady and devoted man he will be missed by all.

As of April 1, 2006 Waste Management stopped servicing our area. This decision left the lake without garbage pickup. Two companies that are willing to cover our area are Little Traverse Disposal Company and Presque Isle & Cheboygan Sanitation. Don't even think of doing as some of our predecessors did many years ago and disposing of waste in the woods – Our lake population, both human and domestic, is too great for that. Let's not litter or pollute our surroundings.
