Open House UM Biological Station Saturday, July 1st, at 2pm

"Bug Camp" offers its annual Open House for all who are interested in learning about the research and educational activities taking place at our Douglas Lake field station.

Dr. Burton Barnes an authority on Michigan Forests and author of Michigan Trees: "A *Guide to the Trees of the Great Lakes Region*" will be a featured speaker. The event begins at 2pm with a welcome and introduction from UMBS Director Knute Nadelhoffer, followed by short presentations by research faculty and students about their work based at UMBS, near Pellston, Michigan. Projects include ongoing research on important topics of current interest to the local community. Afterwards, participants join in a guided tour of the facilities, meet the researchers and see their work up close. Refreshments served.

Established in 1909, the Biological Station is one of the finest and best-equipped inland field stations in the world. With a large array of animals and plants for study, personal interaction with professors and researchers, close associations with other students, easy communication with all, and a daily life close to nature, the Biological Station offers a wealth of opportunity for the developing biologist.

Facilities include a library, computing centers, well-equipped laboratories, special collections of plants and animals, an underground Soil Biotron, atmospheric towers, a research greenhouse, and Stream Laboratory. Students usually live in one-room cabins near the lake that are served by central facilities, including laundry. Faculty members, their families, students, researchers and staff all dine together in a central dining room, adding to the community feel of the campus.
